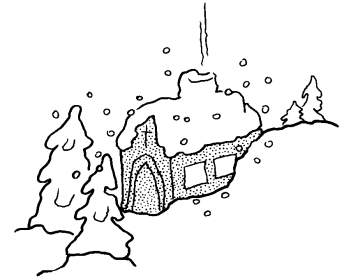

## ROPES MINISTRY UPDATE



For many years now, there has been an announcement nearly every week in the Sunday Church Service Bulletin about the ROPES ministry at Greenwood Church. This weekly announcement reminds all of us to bring in non-perishable food donations to help replenish the supplies at the West Bay Marketplace in Warwick. West Bay Marketplace then distributes these food supplies to needy families and individuals. This year has been an especially difficult one, made more so by the financial crisis and the declining state of our economy.

Despite the trying times, however, folks at Greenwood Church have still stepped up and have continued to give very generously. Your donations are helping to make a difference! Just during November and December of 2009, the members at Greenwood Church donated over five hundred pounds of food! Thank you so much! 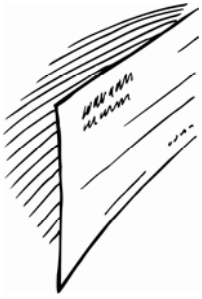
Thank you also to all those who have helped deliver the food donations over the years, including Mike Koczan and Martha Beard. Keep up the great work, Greenwood!

## THE STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE

**“For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for your sakes he became poor, so that you through his poverty might become rich. And here is my advice about what is best for you in this matter: Last year you were the first not only to give but also to have the desire to do so. Now finish the work, so that your eager willingness to do it may be matched by your completion of it, according to your means. For if the willingness is there, the gift is acceptable according to what one has, not according to what he does not have.” (2 Corinthians 8:9-12)**



To date we have received 128 pledge cards in support of our operating budget. The total is \$230,387, a 3% increase in giving for those who have pledged.

To date we have also received 54 pledge cards in support of our Capital Campaign. The total is over \$39,000.

Please return your pledge cards. If you are not in a position to commit to a pledge, return your card indicating that you will give to God's kingdom as you are able.

If you need a pledge card, you can pick one up in the Narthex or the church office.

The Stewardship Committee invites you to consider a new way of giving. Electronic giving provides benefits to both our members and the church. For those who choose to participate, withdrawing the pledged or specified amount from your bank account is truly giving the Biblical "first fruits." It also eliminates the minor frustrations of writing frequent checks or forgetting the checkbook. There will be no cost for this service and you will continue to be issued a giving statement from the church for your tax records. For the church, the advantages are related to a consistent and predictable cash flow and less paperwork. The seasonal fluctuations in giving patterns are lessened with automated giving.

Authorization forms are available in the church office or the narthex. Please fill out the form including a voided check and drop it off in the office. You can cancel your authorization of transfer at any time by notifying us in writing.

Thank you for your prayerful consideration of this new giving opportunity.

## MEMBER CARE COMMITTEE

Dave and Nancy Dickerman have been continuing the enormous task of summarizing the feedback from our visits with many of you last summer. We learned that while some members grew up in this church, many others were led to Greenwood by a family member, neighbor or friend. Why did we join Greenwood Church? The Sunday School, friendliness of the members, the worship services and sermons, and location were the major reasons given, in that order. Listed below are the responses to the question, "What do you think the church does particularly well?" I don't know about you, but as I read the list, my first response was, "Of course, why didn't I think of that?"



1. Sunday School was again at the top of the list with 24 responses.
2. Second was PYF (17)
3. A tie! Presbyterian Women and friendliness, fellowship, and family warmth. (14 each)
4. All aspects are good. (12)
5. Another tie! Worship services and the caring way in which our members look after each other. (10 each)
6. Tie! Sound theological sermons and Circles (9 each)
7. Deacon's work (8)
8. Good choir music (7)
9. Tie! 39ers and support of missionaries (5)
10. There for me at times of spiritual need (3)
11. Coffee Hour (2)
12. Tie! Good church activities, helping us to know Jesus better, unusually fine church, pastoral care for sick and hospitalized, strong volunteers—hold church together, pastor a great person, good music director, Fishermen's News, home visits by members, bazaars/May Breakfast (1 each)

By the time I got to the bottom of the list I was thinking, "You know, Greenwood is a very special church, and we sometimes forget all the things we do well." We all need to reach out as others did for many of us, and invite our friends, relatives, or neighbors to join us in these many wonderful opportunities for fellowship and worship. Maybe we don't even need to reach out to new people, but simply invite members of our Greenwood family to "come home."

Many of you have probably seen the "come home" ads sponsored by the Diocese of Providence. They show people who have realized that something has been missing in their lives since they have drifted away from church for various reasons. As our world becomes increasingly secular, and in some parts, even atheistic, it is more necessary than ever for Christians to gather together for worship and fellowship to give one another support as we go about our daily lives. It is easy to get out of the habit of going to church on Sunday morning and much harder to come back, but for many people, once that first step is taken the rewards are great as the Holy Spirit does His work. So, if you have been away, we invite you to renew your faith and join us in the joyful worship of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.



Despite all we do well, there is much we could do even better. The surveys only turned up a few suggestions here, but they were all excellent. In the coming months we will explore ways in which we can address these needs:

1. Providing meals for families in need.
2. More home visits by Pastor, elders, or other church members
3. Getting in touch with members who stop coming to church, as soon as possible, to show concern
