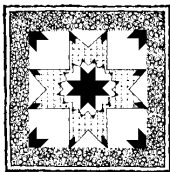
Bethany Christian Services: "Every Life A Promise"

Circle V will meet on Wednesday, June 2, at noon to eat lunch with the MS Key Club.

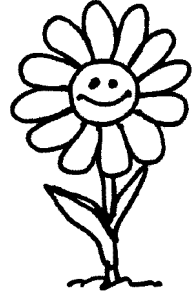

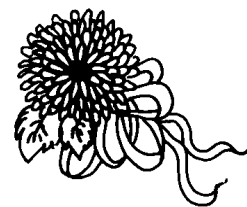

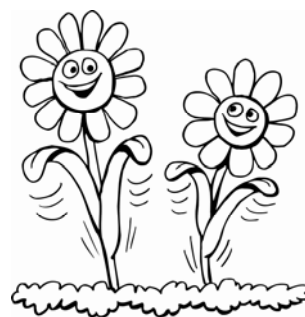
